

Open-Audit and Nmap

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Introduction

Open-Audit uses Nmap in its Discovery function. Without Nmap, Open-Audit will not function correctly. Every Open-Audit install assumes Nmap is installed and will test for it on the Discovery web pages.

Linux

The Linux Open-Audit installer will test for and if required, install Open-Audit's dependencies from your distributions repository. After installing you should run the below to SetUID. This is required for SNMP (UDP 161) detection. This is supported on RedHat/CentOS and Debian/Ubuntu. If you need to manually install Nmap:

For RedHat/CentOS do (**NOTE - if you upgrade using yum, you will need to reapply this "chmod" setting**).

```
sudo yum install nmap
sudo chmod u+s `which nmap`
```

For Debian/Ubuntu run (including setting dpkg to remember your override so an apt-get upgrade will not break Open-Audit).

```
sudo apt-get install nmap
sudo chmod u+s `which nmap`
sudo dpkg-statoverride --list `which nmap`
```

Windows

The Windows Open-Audit installer will test for the presence of Nmap in it's standard install locations of:

C:\Program Files\Nmap\nmap.exe

C:\Program Files (x86)\Nmap\nmap.exe

If the binary is not found in either of these location, a warning message will be displayed in the installer.

To install Nmap on Windows, visit the Nmap page at <https://nmap.org/download.html> and download the Latest Release self-installer. You may need to scroll down the page to find it.

Nmap runs on all versions of Windows since NT, including 2K, XP, Vista, Windows 7, 8, 10, and 11. You can choose from a self-installer (includes dependencies and

The Nmap **executable Windows installer** can handle WinPcap installation, registry preferences, and other system-level tasks. It also includes the Zenmap graphical frontend. Skip all the other options.

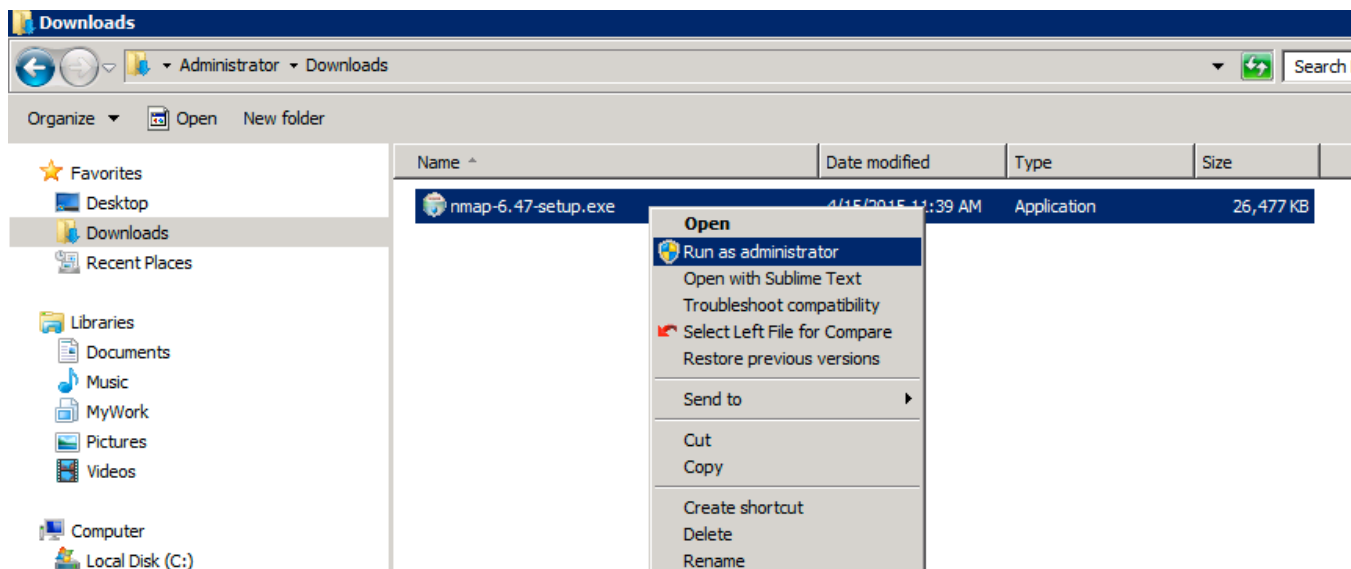

For those who prefer the command-line zip files ([Installation Instructions](#); [Usage Instructions](#)) included with these, so you need to run nmap.exe from a DOS/command window. Or included with the free [Cygwin system](#). Also, you need to run the [Winpcap](#) and [Microsoft Visual C++](#) zip file. The main advantage is that these zip files are a fraction of the size of the executable installer:

Latest command-line zipfile: [nmap-6.47-win32.zip](#)

Save and run the file. Make sure you run the file as an Administrator in order to install it (right click, Run as Administrator).



Use the standard install options when displayed and click the "I Agree", "Next" and "Install" buttons to install Nmap.
